## FAC 11 – Doc 06.3 Developing States Fund (DS) Fund

Secretariat

### 1. Background

Annex 1 of the SPRFMO Financial Regulations provides the purpose of the DS Fund: "The purpose of the DS Fund is to facilitate the effective participation of developing State Contracting Parties of the region, in particular the least developed among them, and small island developing States, and as appropriate, territories and possessions in the work of the Commission and its subsidiary bodies", and "Appropriate records and accounts shall be maintained for the Fund, and the Executive Secretary shall report the status of the Fund, the amount used to provide assistance for the development of technical capacity and details of such assistance, together with the level of available funds, during the annual session of the Commission."

Pursuant to the Financial Regulations, the Secretariat established a separate account in 2017 for the Developing States Fund. This Fund contained the accumulated unspent appropriations from previous financial years (beginning from financial year 2015-16), and unused Members' voluntary contributions for the above stated purpose.

At the FAC9 meeting in January 2022, the Secretariat made a proposal to remove the cap on unspent appropriations as set by Financial Regulations, transfer the balance of the Special Requirements Fund<sup>1</sup> to the Developing States Fund and discontinue the Special Requirements Fund. FAC reviewed the Fund and agreed with this proposal. Revised Financial Regulations (2022) containing this change were adopted by the Commission to support the new operation of the Developing States Fund. This change shall still be subject to the same level of FAC oversight as previously.

After the Annual Meeting of 2022, this change has been reflected in the financial reporting for Developing States Fund (refer to page 8 of <u>FAC11-Doc6</u>).

This paper is prepared in accordance with the 2022 Financial Regulations.

#### **FAC11** considerations:

Bearing in mind the discussions held during FAC9, the SPRFMO Secretariat has proposed that the allocation for the DS Fund remain at **NZ\$35,000** for Financial Year 2024-25.

#### The FAC11 is invited to:

- **Recommend** that the Commission approve the proposed budget amount of NZ\$35,000 for Budget Category 10 Developing States for the Financial Year 2024-25 (as per FAC11-Doc07).
- Note the information contained in this paper.

## 2. Status of Developing States Fund

Since 2015, the Developing States Fund has been used to support developing State Members to participate in the Commission's annual meetings and Scientific Committee's workshops/meetings. Due to the global pandemic, budget items requiring in-person meetings were replaced by virtual meetings during the Financial Year 2019-20 and 2020-21. Since 2022, international travel has resumed.

Table 1 below shows the year-to-date status, as well as the estimated status up to 30 June 2024.

## 3. 2023-24 Applications to use the Developing States Fund

Financial Regulations Annex 1 paragraph 5 provides that "Maximum 60% of the annual budget amount of the DS Fund shall be allocated for participation in the Annual Meeting of the Commission and maximum 40% shall be allocated for participation in the meeting or workshops of the Scientific Committee."

For SPRFMO Financial Year 2023-24, the Commission allocated NZ\$35,000 for Budget Item 9 Developing States (COMM11 – Report ANNEX 5a), therefore, the allocations for the SPRFMO's two main Meetings are:

- For the 11<sup>th</sup> SC Meeting, it is NZ\$14,000.
- For the 12<sup>th</sup> SPRFMO Commission Meeting, it is NZ\$21,000.

As per the guidelines provided by the Financial Regulations, the Secretariat, on behalf of the Organisation, implemented the operation and disbursement of the DS Funds are outlined in the Table 1.
